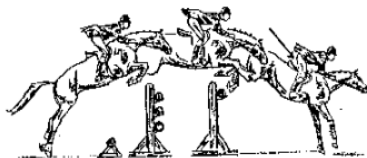
Welcome to Horse Shows in the Park's newest show venue at the Rose Dhu Creek Equestrian Center in Bluffton, South Carolina!!!

Entry Forms: TRAINERS AND EXHIBITORS PLEASE READ!!!

No numbers will be issued until a completed entry blank with all appropriate signatures is received by the show secretary and an open check is attached to it. The rider will NOT be allowed to school unless they are wearing a visible number on their backs as issued by the show office for that show.

Required signatures on Entry Forms:

Unsigned entry forms will not be accepted. Every rider who, if a minor under the age of 18, must sign and also provide the signature of his/her parent or legal guardian on the form. Completed entry blanks should be faxed to 321-978-0231.

Hold Harmless:

Horse Shows in the Park, LLC., (HSITP, LLC) it's/their owners, officers, employees, agents and guests will not be held responsible for accidents or loss which may occur to an exhibitor, spectator, guests, rider, groom, other employee, animal or equipment at the competition. All exhibitors, spectators, guests, riders, grooms or the employees are subject to the rules and regulations of the Rose Dhu Creek Equestrian Center, and HSITP, LLC. **Under South Carolina Law an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of a participant in an equine activity resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities. Pursuant to Article 7, Chapter 9 of Title 47, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976.**

DAMAGES: All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, animals or employees to stalls, buildings, and other properties of the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly.

Returned checks:

A \$30.00 fee will be charged for returned checks with no exception. All accounts must be paid by show's end or \$20 add-on fee applies for non-payment of entries. Individual's names who have outstanding accounts at show's end or who have provided non-negotiable checks may be posted in the show office and on the show website, and may be excluded from participation at future events or required to provide payment for all entries via cash.

PA System:

Riders/trainers be aware and on time. Check in with the Paddock Master and know your order of go. Please notify Paddock Master of any trainer/ring conflicts, tack changes, etc. *Trainer / Ring conflicts will result in the rider's number being placed last in the order of go.*

Dogs/Pets on Show Grounds:

All dogs/pets must be leashed at all times on no longer than a 6' lead Owners of loose animals are subject to a \$50.00 fine. If a dog appears to be intimidating a spectator and/or exhibitor, show management may ask the owner to remove said animal. If a dog or pet interferes with an exhibitor's horse while showing, the entry fees for that exhibitor are the responsibility of the pet owner. No use of retractable leads around horses.

Show Management:

Show management reserves the right to refuse entry of any exhibitor for any reason, or to combine or cancel classes.

Attire/Headgear/Medic:

Polo shirt or sweater, boots, breeches for novice classes on Saturday, jumpers. Proper show attire for all others. Hot weather will see jackets excused and polo shirts or show shirts may be announced as acceptable during the hot summer months. Headgear: All riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved properly fitted headgear/helmets at any time while mounted on show grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, parents, guardian, or trainer of the exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition. A Paramedic may be on duty only when scheduled classes are performing.

Vehicles on Showgrounds:

Vehicles to include golf carts, mopeds, 4 wheelers on show grounds must be **driven only by those having a valid driver's license**. All liability associated with any and all form of motorized conveyance is assumed by the operator and/or owner of said vehicle.

Disputes/Complaints:

Show Management's decision is final in all manner of dispute regarding the show, it's class specifications, logistics or eligibility of horse/rider. Complaints/feedback regarding the show must be directed to show management. Management, at their discretion may choose to involve the individual placing the complaint in such a position to provide direct feedback to the complainant. At show management's discretion, poor sportsman-like behavior or unprofessional/discourteous conduct, will result in the individual asked to leave the show grounds and removed from participation at future events.



RULES AND REGULATIONS HORSE SHOWS IN THE PARK SHOWS

Horse Shows in the Park, LLC is an Affiliate Member of the USEF And USHJA (United States Hunter Jumper Association)

This is an unrecognized show, however all classes may be held in accordance with the rules and specifications of the current USEF rulebook. Decisions of show management are final. Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason.

Arrival/Stabling/Facilities:

Permanent 12 x 14 with full doors, rubber mats (stripped). No tack/feed stalls.

Stalls—first come, however horses showing over Saturday and Sunday get preference. Limited number of stalls available and are \$60 pre-entered by Tues 8 pm for all three days beginning Friday at 1pm or \$35.00 for one day plus applicable sales tax. Bags of shavings are additional to stall fees and may be ordered from the show secretary at 321-693-5551 and are available for purchase at the show. No non boarded horses to be on show grounds without entry blank completed in show office. **Non-showing horses** must be registered at show office and pay a \$20.00 non-showing horse fee, in addition to office fees.

- **Stall assignment** at discretion of show management and will be posted at the barn ends and on the stall. Stall payments will be recorded on the appropriate entry forms. Stall cards may not be removed or re-attached with out approval of show management. Stalls checked periodically during day. No night watch unless otherwise posted in office
- **Stalls** available by reservation with entry, and if not pre-entered or reserved by show day—first come first served basis. No non-showing horses/ponies in stalls. No pre-payment necessary, however stalls reserved and scratched may result in the exhibitor placed last in order of priority for placement at next show.
- **Coggins** - All horses or ponies must be registered with the show office and possess a negative Coggins on the show grounds upon registration in the show. **HORSES WITHOUT A NEGATIVE COGGINS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUNDS, NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- **Trailer/Ship In Fee: None.**
- **No smoking** allowed near any barn area.
- **Trash/Manure**—All manure must be put in the designated areas. Do Not put trash/garbage in the manure area. Garbage containers are provided at the end of each barn.

SHOW OFFICE: open at 1pm the day before the show, and closing 30 min following the last class. The show office will close by 5:30 pm on Friday evening prior to the show.

ENTRY FEES are \$12.00 per class for pre-entries received prior to 8pm on Tuesday before show; \$15.00 per class thereafter. Pre-entry requested to aid in staffing/logistical planning. Marshall & Sterling classes and USHJA Medals are \$22.00. W/T Mini Medal, 2' Medal and Savannah Hunter Classic are \$15.00. Office \$15.00 per day or \$25.00 Fri/Sat/Sun. Medic fee \$6.00 per day Sat and Sunday only. Insurance \$5.00 one time.

Prizes/Ribbons: Available in the clubhouse upstairs area following your classes. Prizes/ribbons for each day must be requested same day of show as earned. All "Show Bucks" earned must be redeemed by November 15, 2010. **Ribbon Buy Back:** Available the Friday before each show, HSITP will purchase your ribbons and/or trophies in perfect condition (no writing on the back, no wrinkles etc.) and credit your show account. Ribbon buyback will not take place on any other day than the Friday before the show. A schedule of pricing will be available in the show office.

HIGH POINT CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE AWARDS EACH SHOW WEEKEND *Minimum average class size of 3 required to award High Points*

Points awarded as follows:

1st place — 7 points	2nd place — 5 points	3rd place — 4 points
4th place — 3 points	5th place — 2 points	6th place — 1 point

Ties will be broken by the Over Fences or Equitation portion of the divisions.

Courtesy to exhibitors, show personnel and equines. As lessor of the facility, Show management has the ability to require any exhibitor, spectator or individual on the show grounds to settle their account with the show office and leave the show grounds immediately if unsportsmanlike, disorderly, or unprofessional, cruel or discourteous conduct is displayed by that individual or party(ies) to that individual. This may also include suspension of all rights to attend future HSITP shows. Show management may ask for assistance from local law enforcement agencies to enforce said rights.

GENERAL SHOW AND PRIZE INFORMATION

A \$500 CHECK will be given after the June show to the barn/farm/trainer whose top 5 riders have the most points overall when all the shows points are added up. The Points will be calculated as follows:

**1st Place = 7 2nd Place = 5 3rd Place = 4 4th Place = 3
5th Place = 2 6th Place = 1**

Prior to the show's start, each rider must declare their trainer/farm's affiliation on their entry form. No changes are allowed after the show starts! Changes may be made between shows if the show offices are notified in writing, however such changes will not affect previous points. Each rider is limited to riding no more than 5 horses per day. A 3 minute gate hold will be in effect, no matter how many horses the rider is riding in the show. During each show the points will be posted for everyone to see and announced.

After the final show in June—the points will be added up, the winners notified and **a presentation of the \$500 check will be made at a special function for all riders to be held at Rose Dhu in July. The winner will receive their check and a trophy with their name on it will be displayed throughout the year at the Low Country Saddlery shop. In addition, each farm/barn/trainer who wins through 3rd place will receive a wonderful plaque for display on the wall of their barn!!**

EARN MORE POINTS WITH SPIRIT!!!

As a special incentive to our barns in hot competition—we'll offer 100 points each show—**available to the barn that displays the most "team spirit" during the show...** this can mean matching t-shirts, saddle pads, horse clothing, cheering, signage, banners, visible signs of great horsemanship displayed toward fellow competitors, feeding of exhibitors, show management, volunteer to put on an equine fashion show at the lunch break, (the possibilities are endless...) and general obvious fun show bribery associated with good sportsmanship. It'll be 50 points to the winner, and 25 points each to second and third place—at each show during the series...judging and evaluation by each show's judge with input from HSITP show staff and gate personnel. Announcement of winners to take place at 4pm on Sunday at each show.

GENERAL SHOW AND PRIZE INFORMATION

This is an HSITP "Short Circuit Series" circuit of shows. That means **each rider's points will be added up per division after each show, and at the series end we'll announce the Champion and Reserve winners for each division who'll receive some great awards!! You must show in 2 out of 3 of the shows' and in the applicable division at least twice to be eligible for the awards...** Those awards will be handed out at a special fun party at Rose Dhu in July...

ONGOING RECOGNITION OF YOUR FARM AND OUR HSITP HILTON HEAD RIDERS

Look to our broadcast emails (currently 450+ addresses strong in the Hilton Head and surrounding areas now!) to go out before and after each show in order to tell the story on the show's competitors and who's won what! What great advertisement for your barn/trainer or just plain great accolades for your riders!! Info and videos will be shared on an ongoing basis with The Island Packet and local area newspapers and periodicals.

Travel Incentives for Barns Far Far Away!!!

HSITP has announced FREE SATURDAY NIGHT STALLS at Rose Dhu for the barn/trainer who has driven the farthest to get to the show (with a 50 mile minimum).

Hotel Incentives Abound!!

Both the Holiday Inn Express and the Marriott Fairfield in Bluffton, SC have announced special room rates of \$64.95 per night for our HSITP riders. Ask for the HSITP rate when booking.

ATTIRE

No Jackets required at these spring/summer shows. Just helmets, britches, boots with heels and riding attire in good taste.

CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

NOVICE AND ACADEMY DIVISIONS

Leadline

Open to riders who have not reached their 7th birthday. An adult is required to lead each entry. Riders may not cross enter into any other class. Disabled riders may be of any age.

Walk

Open to inexperienced riders of any age; riders may not cross enter into any other class/division. Trainers requested in the arena. Equitation poles to demonstrate guidance, jumping position over two ground poles.

Walk Trot

Split by age group. Age groups may be further split into A/B depending on size of division. Open to riders who have not yet cantered in a horse show. May cross enter into Walk-Trot/Canter One at a Time, Walk/Trot Cross Rails, W/T Cross Rails Mini Medal and Baby Green Horse/Pony W/T. Classes may ask for sitting trot, extended trot and halt.

Walk Trot/ Canter 1 @ Time

W/T riders may cross enter. Restricted to riders who have not yet cantered in a group in a show. This class is specifically for inexperienced riders, not inexperienced horses or ponies.

Walk Trot Cross Rails

Riders of any age, not to have cantered in a show. Walk Trot riders may cross enter. Over Fences and a Flat—all judged on Equitation.

Pre-Short/Long Stirrup

Open to beginner riders of all ages who have shown 2 years or less. Consistency of gait over fences to count and simple changes allowed. No cross entry of rider with walk-trot division or short/long stirrups. May cross enter into baby green, in hand classes. Flat class will W/T/C as a group. Horsemanship/Advanced Eq. MiniMiniMedal class may ask for simple tests of equitation within a prescribed course of up to 8 fences..

Short/Long Stirrup Hunter/Equitation – 18"

Riders not to have jumped fences over 2' at a show. Rider may cross enter into Pleasure Division, In Hand and Baby Green and 2' Mini Medal. Riders may **not** cross enter into 2' jumpers or other arenas other than Pleasure. Fences set at simple verticals over flower boxes. Horsemanship/Advanced Eq. MiniMiniMedal class may ask for simple tests of equitation within a prescribed course of up to 8 fences..

Intermediate Rider – 2'

Rider not to have jumped over 2' at a show. Cross entry allowed to Pleasure, Baby Green Horse/Pony, 2' HSITP Mini Medal, Hopeful Hunter, Small/Med Pony or 2' Jumper classes. Fences more substantial and may include boxes, coops, rolltops. May be offered in indoor arena.

Grooming and Showmanship

Open to all hunter or jumper type horses/ponies to be judged on overall condition, cleanliness, proper grooming and appearance. Presentation, attention to detail of horse and handler's ability to model the horse/pony. Eligible for Year End Award Grand – 6th place.

Pleasure Horse/Pony

Open to horses/ponies. Walk, Trot, Canter both ways of the arena. No martingales. Versatility to emphasize usefulness in the hunt field ie; halt, extended trot, sitting trot. Top 12 horses/ponies with highest points at year end will be invited back for year end Championship in November in Jacksonville.

Model Hunter Horse/Pony in Hand (Horse or Pony)

Judged on conformation, way of moving, quality, substance, and soundness. Walk and Jog.

GENERAL

M & S League Membership: League membership is required for points to count for Classes, Classes and Medals that are affiliated with the M & S League. Membership Forms available in show office.

USHJA Outreach Memberships: USHJA membership—regular or Outreach — is required for points to count in the USHJA Outreach Medal classes. Outreach Annual Memberships available for \$15.00 in the show office.

USEF Membership: - not required. HSITP is an affiliate member of the United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA).

EQUITATION

United States Hunter Jumper Association Awards: HSITP as Affiliate Member - Riders Eligible For:

2009 USHJA Affiliate Equitation Medal Awards: A set of National USHJA Equitation Awards for Outreach Competitions. Points are tracked on USHJA.org by state, and riders are eligible for awards from USHJA determined by point standings within the state of their residence. One USHJA high point award will be presented for each medal to the rider who accrues the most points annually in each state. The qualifying period is from December 1 to November 30. USHJA Awards may be presented to the riders at the USHJA annual convention and awards ceremonies. Riders may compete in only one Outreach Medal per competition and do not have to be a USHJA member to compete, however, three USHJA members must complete the course for the class to count for USHJA points purposes. Please access USHJA.com for more information regarding USHJA's point tabulations. Only Outreach Members points are tracked on USHJA's website. Outreach membership applications are available in the show office for \$15.00 per show year.

In addition to eligibility for USHJA awards, points will be tracked per medal category by HSITP, and riders will be eligible for significant year end HSITP awards on the basis of their points earned in these medals. One HSITP Equitation Medal award per rider per year, awards from First to 6th place at year end. Equitation Medal November Finals Qualification for HSITP will also be determined by the top 12 point earners in each medal category. Placings in the Equitation Medal Finals will be double pointed for year end points calculation. **DOUBLE POINTED SHOWS:** All Equitation Medal classes are pointed normally during double pointed shows. The Year End Medal Finals held in Jacksonville in November for each Medal category will be double pointed.

Each show weekend will contain the opportunity to compete **TWICE** in the USHJA Medal Categories:

Bronze Medal – 2'3" - Riders may not cross enter into any division exceeding 2'6" or higher at the same competition.

Silver Medal – 2'6" - - Riders may not cross enter into any class exceeding 3' at the same competition. Riders may not have competed at a national medal class at 3' or higher.

Gold Medal – 3' - Riders may not cross enter into any class exceeding 3'3" at the same competition.

Platinum Medal – 3'3" - Combinations and further testing may be warranted.

HSITP Medals - Annual Year End Ribbons and/or awards will be provided to the top 6 riders with the most points in the Walk Trot Mini Medal, the 2' HSITP Mini Medal, and the Horsemanship/Adv. Eq classes provided they have shown in the class a minimum of 6 times during the show year. The Top 12 eligible riders in each will be invited back to compete in the Year End Medal Finals for additional prizes and awards. The rider's placings in the Medal Finals will be double pointed.

Walk Trot Cross Rails HSITP Mini Medal

Open to any age of rider who has not yet cantered in a show. May be asked to sit the trot, extend the trot and/or halt from the trot. Judge may ask a question of each competitor. Over fences may consist of approx 6-8 cross rails to be taken at a trot.

HSITP Mini-Medal—2'

Open to any age rider who's not jumped over 2' at a show. Riders who place 1-6 in this class are invited back for year end Finals competition in November, if they've not jumped over 2' during the show year.

HUNTERS

Junior/Adult Amateur Hunter-Fence height 3'

Open to amateurs on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance with emphasis on manners and suitability as an amateur's mount. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Pre-Children's, Pre-Adults, or Children's/Adult Hunter at the same show.

Junior/Adult Equitation-Fence height 3'

Open to amateurs of any age on horses or ponies. One over fences and one flat. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Pre-Children's, Pre-Adults, or Children's/Adult Equitation at the same show

Open Working Hunter-Fence height 3'

Open to all horses or ponies ridden by professionals or amateurs with no restrictions. Fences may be raised and jumped at higher fence heights at rider's request.

Pre-Children's/Adult Hunter – Fence height 2'6" Open to riders 17 yrs of age and under who have not jumped over 3' at a show, mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance with emphasis on manners and suitability as an amateur's mount. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Children's/Adult or Junior/Amateur Divisions at the same show.

Pre-Children's/Adult Equitation – Fence height 2'6" – Open to riders 17 yrs of age and under who have not jumped over 3' at a show, mounted on horses or ponies. . One over fences and one flat. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Children's/Adult or Junior/Amateur Divisions at the same show.

Training Hunter—Fence height 2'6" - Open to all horses or ponies ridden by professionals or amateurs with no restrictions.

Childrens/Adult Hunter-Fence height 2'9"

Open to Amateur riders of any age who have not jumped over 3' at a show, mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance with emphasis on manners and suitability as an amateur's mount. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Junior/Amateur Division at the same show.

Children's/Adult Equitation-Fence height 2'9" Open to Amateur riders of any age who have not jumped over 3' at a show, mounted on horses or ponies. One over fences and one flat. Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter into Junior/Amateur at the same show

Modified Children's/Adult Hunter—Fence Height 2'3"

Open to amateur riders of any age who have not competed/jumped higher than 3'. No cross entry into any division over 2'6" at HSITP. Division and year end award category consists of the 5 Modified classes.

Low Hunter—Fence height 2'9" -Open to all horses or ponies ridden by professionals or amateurs with no restrictions.

Children's Pony Hunter

Open to children and juniors mounted on ponies 14.2 hands or less. Fence height 2' for small/mediums and 2'6" for larges. Show management may measure or request USEF pony card if necessary. Pony to jump fence height as mandated by height of pony. Suitability of pony for a rider shall be determined by the height and weight of the rider in relation to the size of the pony. Division of 5 classes, with separation as small/med and Large Pony with Equitation as part of each division. Depending on entries, division may be split for year end award as Small/Med and Large.

Hopeful Hunter Horse/Pony-Fence height 2'.

Open to horses/ponies in their first 2 years of showing who have not competed/jumped higher than 2'6" at a show shown by professional or amateur..

Schooling Hunter—Fence height 2'3"

Open to all horses/ponies with no restrictions, may be ridden by professional or amateur.

Baby Green Horse/Pony

Open to horses or ponies in their first year of showing that have not jumped over 2'. Hunter Hack and cross rails class may be taken at a trot or canter, consistency of gait to count, simple changes allowed. May cross enter into Pleasure Horse/Pony or Hopeful Hunter @ 2'.
